Conflict of Interest Policy

A potential conflict of interest exists when a person is involved in making a decision in which that person, a close associate of that person or the institution/organization of that person have an interest or may gain professionally (e.g. by the selection of a paper submitted to PReMI'23).

A conflict of interest merely requires that the professional judgment of the person might be affected and does not necessarily lead to direct gain.

A close associate includes but is not limited to:

- employed at the same institution/organization, or applied for employment at the same institution/organization;
- advisor of current or recent graduate student (within the last 60 months from the inaugural day of the conference, i.e. December 12, 2023);
- co-author within the last 60 months from December 12, 2023;
- co-investigator on a current grant or research project;
- actively working on a project together;
- related by birth or marriage;
- any other relationship that might affect their judgment.

If a person is aware or suspects a conflict of interest exists, they should declare this to the chair of the relevant decision making body. The chair should declare any possible conflicts that they have to their deputy or the Conference Chair of PReMI'23.

A person who has a conflict of interest should not participate in the discussion or voting related to that decision unless the chair decides that the conflict is sufficiently minor.

All manuscripts submitted to PReMI'23 will be reviewed double-blind, which requires the uploaded papers to be anonymized. However, a person involved in the reviewing of submissions to PReMI'23 as a Reviewer, Program Committee member, or Special Session Chair should declare any potential conflict of interest to the Program Chair of PReMI'23 as soon as any potential conflict becomes known, and should not participate in the reviewing, discussion or decision making for any submission with which they have a conflict.

Similarly, if a member of an Award Committee of PReMI'23 has a conflict of interest (e.g. a recent student of theirs is nominated for an award) then they should declare this to the Conference Chair of PReMI'23, and they should excuse themselves from the discussion and voting on this matter unless the Conference Chair decides that the conflict is sufficiently minor.
